

Anti-amalgamation campaigners gathered in Guyra last Friday, marking one year since Guyra Shire Council became part of Armidale Regional Council.

Around 50 protesters attended the gathering, vowing to maintain the rage and continue fighting for de-amalgamation and the reinstatement of a locally based Guyra Council.

This was the second rally held since the formation of the Amalgamation No Thank You (ANTY) group.

The first rally was held in February, when around 200 people marched in protest against forced amalgamation. Members of the Guyra ANTY group also travelled to Sydney during recent by elections, supporting independent candidates as part of a state wide anti amalgamation protest.

This time a smaller group of protesters marched along the street, gathering in front of the Council Chambers, where rally organisers addressed the assembled crowd.

Gordon Youman said that 12 months on from the amalgamation it was now time for a reality check on how the new council is performing.

"There is still no evidence that amalgamation works," he said. "The only evidence is that it doesn't."

"What was pleasing is that this time there were new people at the rally, some who had not been to the others, so the message is still spreading."

Mr Youman remains confident of success and says that the Guyra ANTY group is not backing down.

"I think we will get our Shire back, if not before 2019 then definitely afterwards," he said. "There are court cases happening now which I expect to go our way."

Year 8 Maths Day

Last week a group of year 8 and 10 Agriculture students from Guyra Central School travelled with Mr Scott Miller to Tenterfield for the Northern Schools Prime Lamb Competition. Here the students were further educated about the different market specifications for lambs, and were tested on their ability to select animals that were suitable for a particular market.

Taylah Mitchell and Gemma Williams were impressive in the junior judging gaining 3rd and 4th respectively out of approximately 150 students.

Along with the students, we entered 16 lambs into the competition with 3 pens of 3 lambs in the light weight and 2 pens in the middle weight. There was also one lamb entered into the individual led section. In the middle weight class Guyra cleaned up placing 1st, 2nd and 4th. We also came away with a 2nd place in the middle weight section.

Congratulations to all students on their outstanding efforts and achievements over the two days.

Guyra Sheep and Lamb Sale Market Report

There was a reduced penning in both the sheep and lamb sections at the Guyra sale on Wednesday May 5th. There was a yarding of 2285 lambs and 1795 sheep for a total of 4080. The quality of the lambs was fair to good with all weight classes represented; well finished heavy weights had a strong representation.

There were very few young trade and heavy weight lambs penned with most having made the transition to an older lamb. Restockers were reasonably well catered for in both the young and shorn lambs. Demand remained high from the full field of regular buyers.

Market trends varied with restockers active on light and medium weight lambs. Good quality restocker lambs experienced little market change with some quality related price changes. Well finished, good quality trade weights sold close



to firm with some of the secondary quality pens cheaper.

The heavy and extra heavy weight lambs saw an improvement in quality with the market trend firm to dearer, averages improving by \$5 to \$6/head and more in places. Competition was strong and demand high for all classes of sheep. High skin values for Merino sheep combined with the strong competition saw market trends much dearer

On behalf of the Guyra Shire residents I would like to thank the group, Amalgamation No Thank You (ANTY) for their tireless work to maintain the issue of the demerger of the local shire.

A successful rally was held in the Guyra main street last Friday (12/5) to mark the 1st. anniversary of the loss of our local shire. This was well attended by quite a large number of people where the progress of the new shire was spoken of at length.

One very pertinent issue discussed was how the Status Quo was to be maintained in the shire for 3 years at least. Suddenly, there is a rush to divest ourselves of Tingha and surrounds. This is in answer to the sales pitch of the authorities that Bigger Is Better when the concept was being sold. Another point was the authority of the Administrator to enact this realignment of the Shire boundary. Does his brief authorize this? It seems that this is outside the status quo.

One point raised was about whether we should have candidates picked and being promoted, at this early stage, for the upcoming ARC election in September. This will be discussed at length in the very near future. We do have it on very reliable authority however, that there could be a complete demerger State wide if we can 'Maintain the Rage'.

I ask that people support the local group ANTY as we will live to regret our current arrangement if it is allowed to remain.

Time to Start Talking - Kara's story

Kara Nicholls is a surprise package. She looks like she has it all together but she is not your typical East Coast working mum. "Far from it!", she says.

What I'm looking at is Kara 2.0, the country girl from Guyra, a constant striver who landed and loved her dream job in investment banking, married the man of her dreams, then was torn down by a mental illness, recovered to crave children, endured rounds of IVF and then found something astonishing.

"I really hated being pregnant", she says. "Nothing about it felt normal. Plus there was this expectation from society to be overwhelmingly happy. Also, everyone was giving me mixed messages like 'Go to the movies! Get your hair done! Sleep!' As if I was going to jail for the rest of my life. I wondered if I had committed a murder? I couldn't get away from it."

And now she's talking about it. As a Non-Executive Director of Gidget Foundation Australia, she's embodying the message too (it's even on the business cards)

Start Talking. "This is our message and its time that I embodied it. It's time for me to start talking too", she says. "All of these things happened and all this evolution, ups and downs have led me here. I feel like I ended up being involved with the Gidget Foundation for a reason. This reason. It's time to start talking."

This evolution has taken Kara from a person who was never really a baby person, to a mum of a 3 and 5 year old who "chases them all day for snuggles. I can't get enough of them. I choose to stay home on nights that other parents might prefer to be out. I'd rather stay home to be with them, they are my everything. I know", she laughs, "a big change."

Complicating Kara's unexpected feelings about pregnancy was the medication managing her pre-existing mental health. An appointment with a Mothersafe nurse was pivotal in easing her guilt and anxiety. "She discussed the potential risks of the medication and emphasised that there was a lot of information available about safety in continuing with it. She also pointed out that going off medication may mean the two of us might not be around." Having sound and logical advice allayed some of her fears — but it was a matter of getting the right advice. She also saw a psychologist regularly and set about exercising to help her feel better along with getting adequate sleep. These were big, necessary changes.

The new Gidget Foundation online video phone consultation program, aptly named Start Talking, is exciting Kara enormously. Not only because it offers hassle-free access, but also reaches those in rural, remote and indigenous areas. "It worries me a lot, mums

and dads in the country... In the city we are more open-minded. In rural and remote areas, if someone isn't feeling well, what do they do? There are stigmas and fewer options. People are expected to dust themselves off and keep their chin up; it's imperative we reach and help these people too."

If there is one thing Kara could tell others, it would be, "Don't internalise and normalise. We say 'I'll get through it, other people have bigger problems.' But things can happen suddenly, life can turn on a coin and you need to have a very, strong foundation and support networks to rely on."

And to her struggling perinatal self, she would send gentle words of hope. "I know that you cannot feel love, any love. But...you have no idea how your 'little people' will make you feel and the endless love you will have for them. Give it time."
