# Forty eight candidates line up for council election

Nominations have closed for the September 9th Armidale Regional Council election with 48 candidates vying for 11 spots on council.

The ballot draw was conducted in Armidale last Wednesday night.

Among the candidates there are 40 fresh faces and eight with previous experience on either Armidale Dumaresq or Guyra Shire Councils.

Former Deputy Mayor Simon Murray and President of the Guyra Chamber of Commerce Aileen MacDonald are the only nominees from the former Guyra Shire.

Of the 48 names on the ballot paper, 23 candidates will be listed as part of four groups and there are 25 individual candidates.

The four groups are headed by David Levingston (No affiliation, 4 candidates), Margaret

Voters can attend either the Guyra Council Chambers or the Armidale Returning Office. You can also register for a postal vote.

# Malpas pipe dream

A pipeline connecting the Guyra water supply to Malpas Dam could become a reality, with Member for Northern Tablelands Adam Marshall launching a petition in an effort to prove there is widespread community support for the project.

Armidale Regional Council has finalised a business case for a \$10.5 million water pipeline from Malpas Dam to Guyra, however Mr Marshall believes the voice of locals could help the project get funded.

The local MP recently met with Deputy Premier John Barilaro to seek funding for the important water security project, which he says could 'singlehandedly solve Guyra's water security and quality issues for decades.'

Guyra uses an average 423 megalitres of water each year which far exceeds the town's storage capacity of 277 megalitres. The pipeline will expand that capacity to more than 740 megalitres, exceeding anticipated growth over the next 30 years. Water quality will also be dramatically improved.

"With low rainfall threatening to leave Guyra dry in recent years, it's clear that action must be taken soon to allow the community's continued growth as a residential and horticultural destination," Mr Marshall said.

"I want to demonstrate to the government that this is a high priority for the Guyra community and every voice I Parliament take to the strengthens my case for the funding to be provided without delay."

Mr Marshall has released a petition which he is encouraging members of the public to sign to show their support for the pipeline.

"The petition calls for the government to fund the pipeline project to ensure Guyra can grow, develop and attract further businesses and residents," he said.

"With demand for water in Guyra growing and far outstripping the current supply and storage capacity, this pipeline is essential to ensure Guyra's future," Mr Marshall

"The project offers substantial benefits for locals, while promoting the sustainable growth of the local horticultural industry.

"With all those boxes checked, I intend to show the government that Guyra won't accept any more delays in funding for this essential project."

The petition to upgrade Guyra's water supply is now available in Mr Marshall's Armidale electorate office (175 Rusden Street) and Armidale Regional Council's Guyra administration office in Bradley Street. The petition is also available online www.adammarshall.com.au/pe

#### Old sheds make new at Showground

New cattle sheds at the Guyra Showground will soon be in place, with demolition work on the existing structures almost complete.

Work is being undertaken by local firm Guyra Welding works. The work is being funded by Armidale Regional Council as part of the Stronger Regions funding which was put in place following the amalgamation

\$201,590 was allocated towards Guyra Showground improvements, addressing needs that were identified by the Guyra Showground Committee through the development of the Guyra Showground Plan.

The new cattle shed will replace two structures which have served the community for many years, but were no longer adequate for the range of events which are hosted at the Showground.

They will allow events to be held regardless of the weather. Work will also be carried out to upgrade electrical facilities.

# Council seeks community input

Armidale Regional Council is seeking input to establish a community 'wish list' of large scale local infrastructure projects.

Service Leader for Economic Development and Marketing Greg Lawrence, said that Council will submit an application to the NSW Government's Stronger Country Communities Fund.

"The state government has allocated \$200 million over the next two years for local infrastructure projects that will help sustain strong regional communities," said Mr Lawrence.

Guyra Sheep & Lamb Sale Market Report

August 9th - The lamb numbers almost doubled, while sheep increased by 600 head. The quality of the lambs was very mixed, ranging from plain condition light weights through to very well finished extra heavy weights.

Heavy weights were well supplied along with quite a few plain condition lambs. The usual buyers were in attendance, once again there was little in the way of restocker activity.

Demand varied along with market trends. The plain condition lambs remained firm. Well finished trade weights experienced little change. Heavy and extra heavy weight lambs met weaker demand and reduced competition to show a cheaper trend, prices were well down.

The increased supply of sheep saw market trends dearer. Due to the low numbers at the previous sale there was a great variation in quality with this impacting on prices.

said

"The community is in invited to consider and prioritise these potential projects or contribute additional ideas."

Projects might include new community facilities like parks, playgrounds, walking and cycling pathways or even exhibition and theatre spaces. Funding could be used to refurbish existing local facilities like swimming pools and libraries or it could be used to enhance local parks or facilities with additions like kitchens or toilet blocks.

"This process will enable

Council to prioritise potential infrastructure so that it is best placed to seek funding for projects with value to the community," Mr Lawrence said.

"The information gathered will be of benefit not only to this funding submission, but into the future as Council continues to pursue opportunities."

## Weekly Wool Market Report

Schute Bell Wool



Just over 52,000 bales were presented to the trade in the first sale back after a three week recess. It was a three day sale in Sydney and Melbourne due to the volume on offer. After a solid opening day the action heated up with good gains made on Wednesday and Thursday. The closing level of the Eastern Market indicator at 1550 is the highest close to a week since AWEX began quoting the market over 20 years ago. The 22 and 23 micron indicators hit new record highs with the 20 and 21 micron indictors closing just a few cents short of their most recent high points. Merino Cardings were the only soft spot in the market. 50,332 bales were sold nationally for the week with a low passed in rate of 3.9%. Major buyers included PJ Morris, Techwool and Fox & Lillie. The positive result this week has certainly come as somewhat of a surprise given the volume that was on offer combined with a sharp rise in exchange rates over the recess period. With demand appearing to be robust this positivity could easily continue as weekly rostered volumes on offer fall over the coming month.

# A First for Fig Tree Park Angus

Fig Tree Park Angus will be holding their inaugural on property bull sale at "Strabanne" Wandsworth, on Sunday 20th August. Four rising two year old and 10 high quality yearling bulls will be offered for sale by Helmsman Auction through Davidson Cameron, Guyra.

Fig Tree Park is run by Jason, Tanya, Jake and Grace Siddell and was established in 1997 on the North Coast of NSW halfway between Lismore and Casino. The Siddell's bred Angus bulls to join to the families Hereford and Black Baldy cows for vealer production. In 2005 the herd was relocated to Glencoe and then to Wandsworth in 2009.

In the past the tops of their yearling bulls have gone into the family's commercial beef operation to produce weaner/feeder steers and heifers. The stud herd consists of around 60 Females which



are comprised of cow families from Medlyn, Mundoo, Comfort Hill, Raff, Patawalla, Kansas, Coolarmagh and Alumy Creek Angus Studs, with sires purchased from Raff, Mundoo, The Grange, Bald Blair, Coolarmagh, Ingold and more recently Glenmorgan and Lawsons Angus herds.

They select for temperament, structural soundness, phenotype, fertility, calving

ease, growth, muscularity, eating quality and longevity underpin breeding decisions with AI used over the best cows in the herd to speed up genetic gain.

In the past bulls have been sold privately out of the paddock, but in an attempt to allow equal opportunity for existing and prospective clients to compete for the best of the bulls, a Helmsman auction will be held.

This year's draft of bulls includes some outstanding yearling heifer bulls sired by EF Complement 8088 and Matauri Reality 839, whose sons averaged \$16,571 and \$15,200 respectively at Millah Murrah last year.

Two of the standout yearling bulls in the sale are sired by Bald Blair Right Answer J94 who was entered into Cohort 5 of the Angus Sire Benchmarking Program and is in the top 1% of the breed for 200 Day Wt, 400 Day Wt, 600 Day Wt, Carcase Wt and Scrotal Size.





"It will be a full day of footy




Guyra Junior Rugby League will host the Group 19 semi-finals this weekend at the Lions Park Sporting Complex
