### Weekly Wool Market Report

The downtrend of last week continued to flow when the wool market opened.

By the time the first day had finished some individual micron categories had been quoted up to 50 cents cheaper with only the better style fine and superfine types managing to hold their ground.

The second day of sales witnessed somewhat of a reversal of fortunes with the market rebounding, particularly for better style types.

The Northern region indicator ended the week 14 cents lower after dipping 30 cents on the first day and recovering 16 cents on the final day.

Wool carrying heavier vegetable matter continues to be heavily discounted as buyers chase the lower vegetable matter better style types. 41,261 bales were sold nationally for the week with a passed in rate of 10%.

Major buyers included Lempriere, Techwool and PJ Morris with all of them purchasing very similar volumes. AWTA test data for the first two months of the season is showing a 4.7% increase in the weight of wool tested nationally. AWEX auction statistics are showing an increase of more than double this at

## New yards for Ebor

Livestock and equine lovers alike will look forward to smoother-run events at Ebor's Sports and Recreation Ground, thanks to a \$30,000 grant to rebuild the ground's dilapidated cattle yards.

Member for Northern Tablelands Adam Marshall said the NSW Government funding, obtained through the Public Reserves Management Fund (PRMF), would help the Trust members completely transform the yards, replacing wood with steel to ensure improved welfare for stock and greater safety for those working in the cattle yards.

"This funding will enable the purchase of new steel fencing supplies, which combined with the Ebor community's incredible generosity and willingness to lend a hand, will stretch a long way," Mr Marshall said.

Mr Marshall said the upgraded yards would make the hosting of the annual Ebor campdraft event significantly less stressful.

"Ebor's Sports and Recreation Ground Trust members are passionate about driving their community forward and this funding will allow them to use gathered funds to improve infrastructure, instead of battling a war of attrition against ageing fencing," he said.

"The ground has already received major upgrades to improve amenities for visitors, with the trust receiving \$35,000 two years ago to rebuild a shower block and install new hot water for campers.

"With new facilities, fencing and an invigorated Reserve Trust, Ebor has a winning hand at the next major campdraft.".

## National Landcare Week


GLENRAC will be celebrating National Landcare Week with a number of events beginning with a leadership training program on the 5th September.

# Roadwork to commence on Wandsworth to Ben Lomond road

Armidale Regional Council will commence work on the Wandsworth to Ben Lomond road this month.

"The work involves related the strength of the

"The work involves resheeting a significant stretch of the well-used road ensuring safer conditions for road-users," said Mark Burgess, Council's Program Leader - Roads &

Drainage Maintenance.

"Gravel production is well underway for the re-sheet which will include rehabilitation of roadside drainage systems as well as the application of a 100mm layer of new gravel along an 8.6km section of the road." Work on the road is expected to start in two weeks

time and last for approximately five weeks - weather permitting.

Once underway, road users are asked to expect delays, follow road side signage and be mindful of the safety of the team undertaking the work and other road users.


