# Guyra Sheep & Lamb Sale Morket Report

January 31st - There was a large supply of lambs suitable to restock and feed in a greatly increased penning. Apart from the store lambs, there was a good supply of well finished trade weight young lambs and not as many in the heavy and extra heavy weight classes.

Overall the quality was fair to good, however there were quite a few of the unshorn lambs displaying increased dryness in the skin. All usual buyers were in attendance. The store lambs attracted strong Southern restocker and feedlot competition, this combined with an improvement in quality resulted in strong price gains through all classes, noticeable particularly in the plainest condition lots.

Trade weight young lambs sold to a dearer trend of \$2 to \$7/head with a quality component. The heaviest weight classes sold to a cheaper trend, averages down by \$5/head. With unshorn

lamb skins drying out there was mention of yields on the decline, thus affecting carcase weights.

On the back of a very strong wool market, grown sheep sales experienced significant price gains with some processors with the ability to harvest wool value rather than a skin value. The quality and condition of the offering varied greatly with a large percentage of well finished heavy weight crossbred ewes and some well finished Merino ewes and wethers carrying good skin length.

## Weekly Wool Market Report



February 2nd - The first day of sales followed on from the downtrend of last week. Almost all types except for some selected Superfine closed the day cheaper with the Northern Indicator retreating a further 20 cents.

The final day of sales set a different tone as the market rallied with nearly all types finishing the day dearer. Whilst the rally was not strong enough to erase the first day losses it was an encouraging sign that price levels may have fallen far enough. 36,594 bales were sold nationally for the week with a passed in rate of 7.8%.

Major buyers included Techwool, Fox & Lillie and PJ Morris with a good spread of buyer support evident. Expected national weekly offerings for the rest of the month are hovering around the 40,000 bale mark.

AWTA test data released yesterday for the season to date showed a large jump in the volume of wool tested nationally in January. This has resulted in a 3.1% rise in the volume of wool tested compared to the same period last season.

Forward market activity was more subdued this week with shorter dated contracts changing hands at levels around 50 cents under the physical.

## LLS rates in the mail

Landholders are currently receiving their Local Land Services rates notices in the mail.

Rates, which are a vital source of income for Local Land Services, will increase in 2018 to meet the demand and community expectations for key services.

Work supported by rates includes:

- supporting landholders to control pests and meet their legal obligations
- our vets' animal health programs
- our biosecurity and surveillance programs which limit and prevent pest and disease incursions
- supporting agriculture and animals during emergencies
- supporting stock identification and traceability systems

Northern Tablelands Local Land Services General Manager, Paul Hutchings, said rates are an essential part of a secure and productive landscape.

"The work of our biosecurity officers and district vets is essential for our region's agricultural industry and wider landscape health," Paul said.

"By paying rates, all landholders have access to technical experts, training and programs to help them manage their land and meet legal obligations.

"Our work in supporting traceability systems such as the national livestock identification system means markets remain confident in our 'clean and green' reputation.

"The biosecurity and surveillance programs we run limit and prevent the incursions of pests and diseases."

There have been increases in the base and variable rates in a move towards a more consistent and standardised rating structure.

"The rate increase means we can continue to protect NSW from biosecurity threats, help communities during emergencies and keep markets open for NSW produce," Paul said.

"We can continue to meet community expectations and deliver a comprehensive service to landholders."

# Financial help for kids' sport fees

Financial assistance is available for kids in the Armidale region to get moving in fitness and recreational activities.

The program is not means tested and families can apply for each eligible child each year.

This year's program launched throughout NSW this week and parents, guardians and carers can

apply for their child's voucher at any time during the year.

Vouchers remain valid for the full calendar year and can be used for registration or membership fees for any approved Active Kids sport or fitness provider.

Providers must offer structured activities for at least eight weeks' duration, providing moderate to vigorous physical activity.

#### Finishing touches to new Kolora building

Finishing touches are being completed at the new Kolora Aged Care facility in Guyra, as Council plans a smooth transition for the service's residents.

Communication services will be installed in coming weeks, in preparation for an official opening of the 32-bed facility in the first half of 2018. The new \$7.5 million facility is located next to the Guyra hospital building, replacing Kolora Age Care's existing 22-bed complex and providing residents with more modern facilities and easier access to health services.

"We had been looking at an earlier transition to the new building but the comfort and care of the residents is our primary concern," Council's Service Leader Community and Customer Service, Krista Schmidt, said.

"Accreditation renewals for Kolora's services are due next month and we want to have all of that in place, as well as a fully completed new building, before implementing a detailed plan to move into the new facility with as little interruption and inconvenience to the residents as possible. Since late last year we have been liaising with residents and their families to prepare for the move. In addition, there are a number of community groups keen to assist with the move."

Visit Council's website for updates on the project, which is being assisted by a \$1.5 million grant from the NSW Department of Health and Ageing and \$500,000 in Federal Government funding through the Member for New England, Barnaby Joyce.
